FORMER PRESIDENT A.P.J. ABDUL KALAM PASSES AWAY

Former President A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, widely acclaimed as the "people's President", passed away on 27th July, after collapsing during a lecture at the Indian Institute of Management in Shillong. Mr. Kalam, the country's 11th President, was one of India's most eminent scientists, and had the unique honour of receiving honorary doctorates from 30 universities and institutions. He was the President between 2002 and 2007, took the lead in the conduct of India's nuclear tests in May 1998 and was later fielded as the National Democratic Alliance candidate by then Prime Minister A.B. Vajpayee. He was laid to rest in his hometown Rameswaram in Tamil Nadu on 30th July.

HALF OF ONLINE WORLD USES FACEBOOK

Half of the world's estimated online population now check in to the social networking giant Facebook at least once a month.

Facebook said the number of people who use it at least monthly grew 13% to 1.49 billion in the three months to the end of June. The number is equal to half of the estimated three billion people who use the internet worldwide. Of those users, it said well over half, 65%, were now accessing Facebook daily. Mobile advertising revenue was the biggest factor, accounting for more than three quarters of the total.

THE 3RD BIGGEST GLOBAL HIT EVER

Dinosaur blockbuster "Jurassic World" has stomped its way up the box office rankings to become the third biggest global hit of all time. The fourth film in the popular "Jurassic Park" series has earned \$1.522 billion worldwide, eclipsing "The Avengers" (\$1.520 billion) to take third spot in the global box office. It is now second only to 2009's "Avatar" (\$2.79 billion) and 1997's "Titanic" (\$2.19 billion), not accounting for inflation. Directed by Colin Trevorrow and executive produced by Steven Spielberg, "Jurassic World" has earned \$614.3 million domestically in the United States, becoming only the fourth film to ever pass \$600 million.

MISSING MH370 PLANE'S NEW CLUE?

Some debris have been found in the western Indian Ocean on 29th July. They appear to be part of a Boeing 777, the same model as Malaysia Airlines Flight 370 that disappeared in 2014. During the initial days of the search for the plane, there were several reports of possible debris sightings in the waters closer to where authorities believe the plane went down, but none of those was actual wreckage. If this turns out to be a piece of MH370, it would be the first piece of physical evidence that the plane crashed.

PETER HIGGS RECEIVES WORLD'S OLDEST SCIENTIFIC PRIZE

Nobel prize winner Peter Higgs has joined the ranks of Charles Darwin and Albert Einstein by winning the world's oldest scientific prize, the Royal Society's Copley Medal, for his pioneering work on the theory of the Higgs boson, which was discovered in 2012. 86-year-old. The Copley medal was first awarded by the Royal Society in 1731, 170 years before the first Nobel Prize.

UK MP DEMANDS 'KOH-I-NOOR' BE RETURNED TO INDIA

British Indian MP Keith Vaz has called for the world-famous 'Koh-i-Noor' diamond to be returned to India during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's UK visit in November. The Koh-i-Noor was mined in medieval times in the Kollur Mine in Andhra Pradesh's Guntur district. The diamond was originally owned by the Kakatiya dynasty, which had installed it in a temple of a Hindu goddess as her eye. It passed through the hands of various invaders and was finally confiscated by the British during the Raj. Today the diamond is a part of the Crown of Queen Elizabeth II.

Indian-American Mary Thomas, a government attorney in Florida, has said that she will run for the US Congressional elections in November 2016. If elected, Thomas, whose parents arrived in America from India in 1972, would be the first woman Indian-American lawmaker to be a member of the US House of Representatives.

MUMBAI BOMBER YAKUB MEMON HANGED

The man considered to be the mastermind behind coordinated bomb attacks in Mumbai in 1993 that left 257 people dead has been executed. He was originally sentenced to death in 2007 as a key conspirator behind 12 blasts that ripped through several hotels, marketplaces and buildings in Mumbai on March 12, 1993. The judiciary stood like a rock behind its judgments and decisions in Memon's case, including his final petition on 29 July intended to delay the inevitable. The executive handled the sensitive issue sensibly and cleanly. The lawyers of Memon fought tooth-and-nail to save their client, and the Maharashtra government and Nagpur jail authorities did their duty with firmness and care.



The OED currently has a first quotation for electronic mail from 1975; the shorter email is first attested four years later, in 1979. The OED occasionally issues "OED Appeals" in which editors solicit help in uncovering new information about the history and usage of English.

DR. A.P.J. ABDUL KALAM

WHO WAS DR. ABDUL KALAM?



Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam was an Indian scientist who served as the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007. Kalam was born and raised in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu and studied physics and aerospace engineering. He spent the next four decades as a scientist and science administrator, mainly at the Defence Research and Development Organisation and Indian Space Research Organisation and was intimately involved in India's civilian space program and military missile development efforts.

WHY IS HE CALLED THE MISSILE MAN OF INDIA?

He thus came to be known as the Missile Man of India for his work on the development of ballistic missile and launch vehicle technology. He also played a pivotal organizational, technical and political role in India's Pokhran-II nuclear tests in 1998, the first since the original nuclear test by India in 1974.

WHEN WAS KALAM ELECTED AS INDIA'S PRESIDENT?

Kalam was elected President of India in 2002. After serving a term of five years, he returned to his civilian life of education, writing, and public service. He has received several prestigious awards, including the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour.

NASA DISCOVERS FIRST NEAR-EARTH-SIZE PLANET

NASA's Kepler mission has discovered the first near-Earth-size planet in the "habitable zone" around a Sun-like star. This discovery joins 11 other new small habitable zone candidate planets, marking another milestone in the journey to find another "Earth." "The newly discovered Kepler-452b, located 1,400 light-years away in the constellation Cygnus, is the smallest planet to date discovered orbiting in the habitable zone — the area around a star where liquid.



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HAWKING ANNOUNCES \$100 MILLION SEARCH FOR ET

Russian billionaire Yuri Milner, Stephen Hawking, Martin Rees, Frank Drake and others have announced \$100 million funding for Breakthrough Listen — the "most powerful, comprehensive, and intensive scientific search ever undertaken for signs of intelligent life beyond Earth." The search will be done at two of the largest radio telescopes, the 100 Meter Robert C. Byrd Green Bank Telescope in West Virginia, the world's largest steerable radio telescope; and the 64-metre diameter Parkes Telescope in New South Wales, Australia.



FOUR-LEGGED SNAKE FOSSIL DISCOVERED



A 113-million-year-old fossil from Brazil has been discovered and is the first four-legged snake that scientists have ever seen. Several other fossil snakes have been found with hind limbs, but the new find is estimated to be a direct ancestor of modern snakes. Its delicate arms and legs were not used

for walking, but probably helped the creature to grab its prey. The fossil shows adaptations for burrowing, not swimming, strengthening the idea that snakes evolved on land.

❖ Pluto could have glaciers of nitrogen ice, new photographs from Nasa's New Horizons probe suggest. Scientists believe they see evidence of surface material having flowed around mountains and even ponding in craters.

APPLE'S IPHONE 6S REVEALED



Apple's next iPhone is believed will be unveiled in September. The handset is expected to look identical to the current 6 and 6s, but have a major overhaul of its internals and a new 'touch force' screen. The tech giant has ordered suppliers to manufacture between 85 million and 90 million units combined of two

new iPhone models with 4.7-inch and 5.5-inch displays by Dec. 31. Every year following a major update to its phone hardware, Apple releases an incrementally upgraded handset that features minor tweaks.

FACEBOOK OPENS INTERNET.ORG TO MORE MOBILE OPERATORS

Facebook is inviting additional mobile operators to take part in Internet.org, its project to bring Internet access to poorly connected parts of the world. Internet.org turns one year old this weekend. Internet.org turns one year old this week, and Facebook says it's ready to scale the project to reach more people. The company is making it easier for more mobile operators to join the project by launching an online portal where they'll find technical tools and best practices to help them get started.



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SONY PICTURES BUYS RIGHTS TO MAKE AN EMOJI MOVIE

Sony Pictures Animation has bought the rights to turn emoji icons into a movie.

Emojis, which are symbols that help described feelings or emotions, are used by millions of people around the world in texts, online chats and on social media. Emojis were developed in Japan in the late 1990s as smiley-faced emoticons. They have developed from graphics that represent faces to a wider range of things, including pets, objects and poo. Thirty-eight new emojis will be released next year, including a clown face, wilted flower and a "call me" hand.
