

BEIJING TO HOST 2022 WINTER GAMES

Beijing won the secret vote of the International Olympic Committee by 44-40, with one abstention. The vote was conducted by paper ballot, after the first electronic vote experienced technical faults with the voting tablets. The Chinese capital, which hosted the 2008 Summer Olympics, came in to the vote against the city from Kazakhstan as the strong favourite, despite its lack of natural snow.

ARE ALIENS LISTENING?

NASA has posted the 'Golden Record' on an online audio distribution platform 'Soundcloud'. 'Golden Record' is a collection of sounds that NASA has selected to be sent on the Voyager spacecraft which was launched in 1977. NASA has added musical selections from different cultures and eras, and spoken greetings from Earth-people in fifty-five languages, including Indian languages like Hindi, Marathi, Bengali and others. The aliens would pick up lines such as "Prithvi ke wasiyon ki aur se Namaskar" or "Greetings from the earthlings" if they listen the recordings of Earth sounds and greetings sent into space by NASA. Voyager 2 was launched on August 20, 1977, and Voyager 1 was launched on September 5, both carrying the Golden Records encoded with the sounds of Earth. Now, both the probes are farther away from Earth than any other man-made object. Voyager 1 is about 12 billion miles from Earth.

Japanese police have arrested the CEO of the failed company MtGox, which was once the world's biggest exchange of the virtual currency, bitcoin. Mark Karpeles, 30, is being held in connection with the loss of bitcoins worth \$387m (£247m, €351m) last February. He is suspected of having accessed the exchange's computer system to falsify data on its outstanding balance. MtGox claimed it was caused by a bug but it later filed for bankruptcy.

India's biggest multi-application solar telescope (MAST) was inaugurated at the Udaipur Solar Observatory on 4th August by Prof UR Rao, the chairman of the governing council of the Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad. MAST would help in the study of movements of stars and sun even in day time. Besides providing 3-D images of solar activities like solar blast and solar flares, MAST could

help in vital studies about other planetary movements. MAST, designed in 2004, had optical elements added to it till 2008. MAST has a lens of 50 centimetre diameter and is developed on the basis of mechanical and optical system of Belgium.

DEBRIS BELONG TO MISSING MALAYSIA FLIGHT MH370



Malaysia's Prime Minister Najib Razak has confirmed that plane debris found on the shore of Reunion Island in the Indian Ocean belongs to missing Malaysia Airlines flight MH370. The large object, now understood to

be part of the crashed plane, was found on July 29 on the small French island east of Madagascar. Authorities and aviation experts quickly determined that the piece appeared to be from a Boeing 777, the same type of aircraft as MH370 -- and was possibly part of its wing. On August 3, The Malaysian government confirmed that the object, a wing piece known as a flaperon, belonged to a plane of that type.


1Password is now available on Apple Watch.

Apple Watch has taken the world by storm. There are other wearables in the market, but Apple's brand adds heavily to the company's bottom line. With the watch's popularity, almost every app that was available for iPhones and iPads is now available for the tiny device. AgileBits, the company that created the useful 1Password app, have created a version for

the increasingly popular Apple Watch. This app can be downloaded with all the updates from the App Store. 1Password is an app that remembers all your passwords. So, you can login to anywhere with just a tap.

THE JAMES WEBB SPACE TELESCOPE

The James Webb Space Telescope (JWST), previously known as Next Generation Space Telescope (NGST), is a space observatory under construction and scheduled to launch in October 2018.



HOW DID IT GET ITS NAME?

It is named after James E. Webb, the second administrator of NASA, who played an integral role in the Apollo program.

WHAT ARE THE CAPABILITIES OF JWST?

- * Search for the first galaxies or luminous objects formed after the Big Bang.
- * Determine how galaxies evolved from their formation until now.
- * Observe the formation of stars from the first stages to the formation of planetary systems.
- * Measure the physical and chemical properties of planetary systems, including our own Solar System, and investigate the potential for life in those systems.

DID YOU KNOW?

1. It's as big as a tennis court

With a sunshield 22 metres in length, the size of a tennis court, and a mirror 6.5 metres wide the JWST, which is due to launch in October 2018, is over twice the size of the Hubble Space Telescope, making it the largest space telescope ever launched.

2. The mirrors are coated in a golf ball's worth of gold

The JWST's mirrors are covered in gold to optimise them for infrared light, with the gold further protected by a thin layer of glass. The thickness of this gold coating is 0.00001 centimetres across the 25 square-metre mirror's surface, and in total the gold weighs 48.25 grams, roughly equivalent to the weight of a golf ball.

3. It could find water on exoplanets

One of the JWST's most notable abilities is that it will be able to detect planets around nearby stars by measuring infrared radiation, and it will even be able to measure the atmospheres of exoplanets by studying the starlight that passes through. By doing this it will be able to determine if an exoplanet has liquid water on its surface.

4. It's seven times more powerful than the Hubble Space Telescope

The giant mirror of the JWST is made of 18 individual hexagonal segments composed of lightweight beryllium. It is almost three times the size of Hubble's mirror, boasting a light-collecting area seven times greater, but both mirrors weigh almost the same owing to the lighter materials used on the JWST's mirror.

5. It'll see the first light of the universe

One of the goals of the JWST is to observe the first stars and galaxies that formed just a few hundred million years after the Big Bang, an era of the universe that is not fully understood. The telescope will be sensitive to infrared light, which will enable it to do this.




THREE SUPER-EARTHS FOUND

Astronomers have found a planetary system with three super-Earths orbiting a bright, dwarf star -- one of them likely a volcanic world of molten rock. The four-planet system had been hiding out in the M-shaped, northern hemisphere constellation Cassiopeia, "just" 21 light years from Earth. It comprises four planets -- one giant and three super-Earths orbiting a star dubbed HD219134. Super-Earths have a mass higher than Earth's but are lighter than gas giants like Neptune, Saturn or Jupiter. They can be made of gas, rock, or both.



ANIMATED GIFS!

Looks like emojis, also known as pictorial images, are now out of date as a new format called Graphics Interchange Formats (better known by its acronym GIFs) are emerging as the new messaging language. Created by Steve Wilhite, a programmer at CompuServe, in 1987, GIFs have since come into widespread usage on the World Wide Web due to its wide support and portability. GIF animations have become very popular amongst the youngsters. GIFs are marked by certain characteristics and are typically a few seconds long, soundless and only play once when you open the post and then stop.



CHINA CONSTRUCTING THE WORLD'S LARGEST TELESCOPE

China is constructing the world's largest telescope with a dish size of 30 football fields Supercomputer Skyeeye-1, capable of a quadrillion computing operations per second, will support space exploration by the world's largest radio telescope whose dish size will be equivalent to 30 football fields. The telescope will be put into use by September, 2016 and will become the largest in the world. China has invested 667 million Yuan in the construction and only the site selection took 15 years. The construction of the telescope began in March 2011 in a natural, bowl-shaped valley in the southern part of Guizhou.



3D-PRINTED ROBOTIC ARM

A 17-year-old Indian-origin boy in the US has developed a low-cost 3D-printed robotic arm that is programmed to replicate movements of a human hand - such as pinching, grabbing or holding a spoon. Nilay Mehta, student of the Irvine High School in California, US, has won six science fair awards so far for his creation, including third place at an international fair held earlier this year. The robotic arm, made with 3D printed parts, operates by voice command. The user can make the hand perform specific movements by speaking into a small microphone attached to the arm.



ENDANGERED SEAHORSES COULD BE EXTINCT



Seahorses, which have existed for 13 million years, could be the creatures of the past in three decades unless a drastic action is taken. According to official figures, 64 million of the delicate creatures are taken from oceans annually for Chinese medicine and the curio trade, and

conservationists are calling for a ban on shops in Britain selling the dried fish as holiday souvenirs. Seahorses, which can be 14 inches long, are the only creature where the male has a complete reversed pregnancy, with the female transferring her eggs to the male to carry.

THE WORLD'S FIRST 3D-PRINTED CAR

A California automotive start-up is hoping their prototype supercar will redefine car manufacturing. The sleek race car dubbed 'Blade' has come out of a 3D printer. The Blade is fitted with a 700 horse power engine that runs on natural gas, reducing its carbon footprint even further. By using carbon fiber instead of steel or aluminum for the body, the entire vehicle only weighs 635kg, giving it twice the weight to horsepower ratio of a Bugatti Veyron.



The actual smallest sovereign entity in the world is the Sovereign Military Order of Malta (S.M.O.M). It is located in the city of Rome, Italy, has an area of two tennis courts, and as of 2001 has a population of 80, 20 less people than the Vatican. It is a sovereign entity under international law, just as the Vatican is.
